# **OUR TRIAGE PROTOCOL**

#### EMERGENCY VETERINARY CARE IS PRIORITIZED BASED ON THE SEVERITY OF THE PET'S CONDITION.

A team member will bring your pet in for initial evaluation. Based on priority level, the patient will be seen as soon as possible. There may be delays for priority yellow and green patients.

### STAT

- Actively seizuring
- Allergic reactions
- Bloat (GDV)
- Collapse
- Difficulty breathing / choking
- Excessive bleeding
- Excessive lethargy
- Heat-stroke
- Hit by car
- Open fracture
- Open mouth breathing (cat)
- Paralysis

LIFE SAVING MEASURES TO BE APPLIED IMMEDIATELY

- Pediatric fading
- Poisoning

## **PRIORITY** 1

- Bowel Obstruction / diarrhea
- Closed fracture
- Difficulty urinating

### **PRIORITY 2**

- Abscess / skin conditions
- Chronic diseases

### NOT LIFE THREATENING (WAIT TIMES MAY BE PROLONGED)

- Lameness
- Sore / itchy ears

#### ALL PRIMARY CARE SERVICES (I.E. VACCINES) ARE THE LOWEST PRIORITY

Minor wounds
